Student Suicide Prevention

STUDENT SUICIDE PREVENTION/INTERVENTION/POSTVENTION

4 Weakley County Schools are committed to protecting the health and well-being of all students 5 and understands that physical, behavioral, and emotional health are integral components of student achievement. Faculty and staff are expected to be proactive in maintaining a safe and 6 7 supportive learning environment and to immediately report to the building principal any indications that a student may be in danger of harming themselves or others. Students are 8 9 strongly encouraged to report if they or another student are feeling suicidal or in need of help. A 10 summary of available resources shall be regularly updated and posted for students. 11 PREVENTION 12 13 14 All district employees shall attend either an annual in-service training in suicide prevention at the building level or participate in other equivalent training approved by the director of schools. This 15 training will be compliant with Tennessee law. The training shall include, but not be limited to, 16 17 identification of risk factors, warning signs, intervention and response procedures, referrals, and postvention strategies. 18 19 The director of schools shall identify a district suicide prevention coordinator responsible for 20 planning, coordinating and monitoring the implementation of this policy. Each principal shall 21 designate a school suicide prevention coordinator to act as a point of contact for issues relating to 22 23 suicide prevention and policy implementation. 24 25 **INTERVENTION** 26 27 Any employee who has reason to believe that a student is at imminent risk of suicide shall report such belief to the principal or designee. Belief that a student is at imminent risk of suicide shall 28 include, but not be limited to, the student verbalizing the desire to commit suicide, evidence of a 29 suicide attempt, an act of self-harm, or a student self-referral. 30

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Monitoring:

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2 3 Descriptor Term:

Upon notification, the principal or designee shall ensure the student is placed under continuous
adult supervision. The school counselor, social worker or school nurse will contact the state
contracted youth crisis service provider.

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Emergency medical services shall be contacted immediately if an in-school suicide attemptoccurs.

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The principal or designee shall contact the director of schools or designee as soon as practicable.

41 Prior to contacting the student's parent/guardian, the principal or designee, in consultation with

42 the school counselor and/or social worker, shall determine if there could be further risk of harm

43 resulting from parent/guardian notification.

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- 1 If parent/guardian notification could result in further risk of harm or endanger the health or
- wellbeing of the student, then local law enforcement and the Department of Children's Servicesshall be contacted.
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- 5 If appropriate, the principal or designee shall contact the student's parent/guardian and shall:
- 6 1. Inform the parent/guardian that there is reason to believe the student is at risk of suicide;
- 7 2. Inform the parent/guardian if emergency services were contacted;
- 8 3. Ask the parent/guardian whether he/she wishes to obtain or has obtained mental health 9 counseling for the student;
- 10 4. Provide the names of community mental health counseling resources if appropriate.
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- 12 The principal or designee will seek parental permission to communicate with outside mental 13 health care providers regarding a student.
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- 15 If the student is under the age of 16 and the parent/guardian refuses to seek appropriate
- 16 assistance, the principal or designee shall contact the Department of Children's Services.
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- 18 The principal or designee shall document the incident, including contact with the
- 19 parent/guardian, by recording:
- 1. The time, date and circumstances which resulted in the student coming to the attention ofschool officials;
- 22 2. A timeline of the specific actions taken by school officials;
- 23 3. The parent/guardian contacted, including attempts;
- 24 4. The parent/guardian's response; and
- 25 5. Time and date of release of student to authorized individual.
- 26 6. Anticipated follow-up and safety plan.
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Prior to a student returning to school, the principal and/or designee, the school counselor and the

school social worker if desired, shall meet with the student and his/her parent or guardian in

- 30 order to develop a safety plan.
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The safety plan shall identify actions the student's caregivers and school personnel will take to insure the safety of the student.

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The principal will identify an employee to periodically meet with the student to monitor his/her safety and address any problems or concerns with re-entry.

3738 POSTVENTION

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40 Immediately following notification of a student death by suicide, the school and district crisis

- 41 team shall meet to develop a building postvention plan.
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- 43 At a minimum, the postvention plan shall address the following:
- 44 1. Verification of death;
- 45 2. Preparation of school and/or district response, including support services;
- 46 3. Informing faculty and staff of a student death;

- 1 4. Informing students that a death has occurred;
- 2 5. Provide appropriate resource information to students, faculty/staff and parents.
- 3 4
 - The crisis team shall work with teachers to identify the students most likely to be impacted by
- 5 the death in order to provide additional assistance and counseling if needed.
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- 7 Additionally, staff and faculty will immediately review suicide warning signs and reporting
- 8 requirements.
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- 10 The director of schools or designee shall be responsible for all media inquiries.
